Schoolkids 'targeted to join union'

HIGH school students are being pushed into retail training to boost membership of the "shoppies" union, Opposition spokesman David Pisoni has claimed.

He said the Government was favouring retail trainees because it wanted more members for the retail union behind "the dominant (Right) faction of the Labor Party".

Education Minister Jennifer Rankine branded the claim as "desperation beyond belief" and called on Mr Pisoni to resign.
